PBIS is an organizing framework our school uses to improve school safety and promote positive behavior.

The focus of PBIS is prevention, not punishment. The focus is on skills they need to improve to learn and grow as learners & leaders!

Forms of Positive Recognition

- Classroom Rewards

 - Individual students use to shop at rewards store
 - PAW-SOME Tickets
 - Classroom pride awards acknowledge the classroom as a whole and they receive the Bulldog Mascot as a reminder of their efforts
 - Leading with Joy Parade
 - Students who exhibit the expectations of the school from each classroom

Hamilton-Parsons' students follow school-wide PBIS in all locations across all areas of the school. Classroom expectations are built together as a class community. These are school-wide expectations for every one, every place, every time.
